John Beazley will be celebrating Holy Communion from 10am as usual and after coffee will lead the next of St Andrew's Seminars on the Creeds - "On October 4th our focus falls on the second great Christological controversy, which considered the claim, '...and the Word was made flesh.'

It had been troublesome enough for the Church to disentangle the problems surrounding the claim, '...and the Word was God.' Now they had to face such challenges as: How did the 'Incarnation' occur? In what way was it possible for Jesus to be both true man and true God? What form of brain/mind had Jesus if, indeed, he was the Logos incarnate?

Arius and his followers had argued, 'There was (a time) when he (the Son) was not!' which prompted the Council of Nicaea (in 325). Now it was the turn of Apollinarius, Nestorius, and Eutyches, powerful opponents who triggered the Councils of Constantinople (381), Ephesus (431), and Chalcedon (451)."

Do join us after coffee for this discussion if you would care to."

Afterwards, there should be time for a refill of coffee before you take your seats promptly at 12noon to listen to Apol or you could wait for the short interval about half way through. Any visitors for the recital only should arrive by 11.45.
