This discussion on next steps for SEP has not led to much progress. As I write, there is still no answer from the Diocese on the widening of the advert to include lay persons and the next meeting between Gill and Paul Smith and CPAS for support with the advertising process isn't until 24th August. It is likely that we will not see a replacement for David for around twelve months.

Some of the past Standing Committee and others from the Leadership Team met on 14th July to look again at possible next steps, but we are waiting for the current ministry to develop acceptable suggestions for a new structure for the SEP as, like many other Partnerships in England, it is lay ministers who may be the most valuable pastoral care and spiritual leadership in the future.
