The Standing Committee discussed your points on Thursday 27th October and will determine a way forward at the Stantonbury Ecumenical Partnership Council meeting on Thursday 17th November. I'll put the outcome in the December newsletter and your reps will also be able to let you know what will happen next.



Winter Night Shelter MK

Throughout the pandemic the Winter Night Shelter MK has continued to provide support to local homeless adults through their daytime work at Unity Park – the old bus station through offering support and triage services and offering meals.

As there is a growing need with the approach of winter and thoughts that the government is unlikely to continue with their 'housing everyone through winter' scheme, the Woburn Sands branch is going to open up again in St Mary's Catholic Church hall to provide overnight shelter on Sundays between 4th December and Sunday 26th March 2023. It is a really worthwhile thing to do in serving others and a stark reminder that homelessness can be very close to us all.

Baptism Celebrations!

The Methodist Church in Zimbabwe Fellowship (MCZF) Milton Keynes Branch held its first Baptisms since its inauguration in November 2021. The well attended service was held at Freeman Memorial Methodist Church on 18th September. Invited guests included the fellowship groups from the Salvation Army, United Methodist Church and Church of England.

MKUH Interfaith Week Chaplaincy Team Walk - November 2022

The Chaplaincy team which covers Milton Keynes University Hospital and Willen Hospice have been working hard over the past year to visit faith and belief communities to learn more about the worldviews of those in our city and what support would be valuable to them if they or a loved one became unwell and was in hospital. As part of Interfaith Week 2022 the team have decided to do a sponsored walk which takes in places of worship in our city. They hope that people will join them for parts of the journey to walk and talk about the value of interfaith relationships and support within a chaplaincy context.

The walk will be approximately 14 miles long and take in Willen hospice, Nipponzan Buddhist temple, Murugan Hindu Temple, Sikh Gurdwara, Reform Jewish Synagogue, St Augustine's Roman Catholic Church, Milton Keynes Islamic Centre and the ecumenical church, Christ the King, Kents Hill, starting and finishing at MKUH.

The team will be briefly stopping in each location to talk to people from the community and to share their hopes for the expansion of the chaplaincy service to be more inclusive of a broad range of faiths and worldviews. People are then welcome to join in with the walk and continue those conversations.

The money they raise will go towards this goal of deeper inclusion, which includes appointing two additional chaplains to make their team more representative of the diverse faith and belief groups within our city.
