I start this issue with a personal message from Tim Norwood:

Dear friends and colleagues,

I am both sad and excited to announce that that I will be stepping down as Area Dean after 16 years in the role. It has been a huge privilege to serve the people and churches of Milton Keynes, but the time has come for me to move on.

I will begin a new role as National Officer for Local Ecumenism, starting on May 1st. This will be based in London, and I hope to stay in Milton Keynes.

My final service as Area Dean will be on the evening of March 5th at 6:00pm with Evensong at the Church of Christ the Cornerstone.

This might seem quick, but we have had to delay an announcement while the paperwork was processed.

Discussions have already begun about any handovers.

In the meantime, please pray for me, and my new colleagues, as I will continue to pray for you.

I am sure we will all pray for Tim in his new role and as soon as I hear any news of Tim's replacement, I will pass it on.

Ministry Appointments

The Deanery agreed to support SEP's motion for appointment of ministers and it has now gone forward to the Archdeaconry meeting. The motion is still as below:

2023: advertise for a full-time Anglican post available from August/September 2023, the expectation being that they would be appointed to take on the role of team leader, with a focus on mission and could be Team Rector following Paul's retirement.

2024: early in this year appoint a full-time Baptist Minister with a focus on Vision Enabling. (These roles could be swopped round).

It would be hoped that by 2025 there would be 1 full-time ordained Anglican minister, 1 full-time ordained Baptist minister, 1 or 2 house for duty and 1 non-Stipendiary Anglican ministers and 0.2 Methodist minister. The Methodist Circuit has agreed to our request to reduce support from .25 to .2 on the new appointment to replace Nicola when she retires in late 2023.

When we can get external agreement to go ahead with this plan we need volunteers to help amend the current Profile, Role and Person Specifications with Adrian and Paul Brookman to help. Please let me know if you are interested in helping write this up. No one came forward to help with these appointment documents last month, so please let me know if you can help this month. Sharron

News from Diocese of Oxford

Climate Change to Care for Creation

The transition to low-carbon heat is fundamental in the path to net zero, given that 17% of the UK's greenhouse gas emissions come from our homes. That's why our £10 million expenditure on environmental works to improve the carbon footprint of vicarages goes well beyond helping to reach our Net Zero target... our actions to install heat pumps and undertake other energy reduction measures will influence other households in the parish.

Everyone in the diocese can make an impact. Did you know that at least three of the top five things you can do to reduce your individual carbon footprint are low or no cost?

- 1. Reduce your car usage and use public transport more
- 2. Stop or reduce air travel
- 3. Register to switch to renewable electricity as soon as the current energy crisis is over.

Marriage and Civil Partnership (Minimum Age) Act 2022

The Marriage and Civil Partnership (Minimum Age) Act 2022 received Royal Assent in April 2022. The Government has announced that it is planned to come into effect on Monday 27th February 2023.

At present, a person aged 16 or 17 may be married with parental consent. The new Act, once in force, amends the Marriage Act 1949 and other relevant legislation to increase the legal minimum age to 18, and makes it a criminal offence for a person to carry out "any conduct for the purpose of causing a child to enter into marriage before the child's eighteenth birthday".

It will, therefore, no longer be legal for a clergyperson to conduct the marriage of any person under the age of 18 from 27th February 2023, even if preliminaries for that marriage (such as the calling of banns) have been started or completed before the Act comes into force.

EARTHQUAKE DISASTER IN TURKEY AND SYRIA

What can our six congregations do to help the ones in the middle of this crisis.

As Christians, we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday 22nd February. During Lent we reflect on what must have been going through Christ's mind during the 40 days in the desert, as he decided what he must do with his life, and how we can be repentant for the things we have not done. Lent ends on Thursday 6th April.

During Lent our 6 congregations would like to help those in our communities who are feeling as helpless as we do, in the face of this crisis, by welcoming anyone to drop off their donation at any of the churches below.
