Minister's Letter September 2023: Saying Goodbye and Hello!

When Methodist Ministers move, they usually do so all around the same time over the summer. There are lots of good things about this, such as coordinating with students changing classes, schools and colleges etc. But it can also be a bit intense as there are an awful lot of goodbyes all at the same time. There will have been a lot of goodbye's for Nicola Martyn-Beck and for those that have got to know her as a member of the community, as a church leader, and as a disciple / apprentice of Jesus. Every goodbye inevitably involves a lot of sadness, so it is good to be aware of that and to use the summer to take time to pause, to not rush, and to change gear and adjust in your own time, trusting in Jesus' words at the end of the Gospel of Matthew: "I am with you always, to the very end of the age".

Like Sarah's family, you may be facing other changes too, and so are working hard to hold on to those words of Jesus. Some of you may know that Sarah's Dad, Rob, went into Milton Keynes Hospital over the summer. The various health and care team and people have been brilliant, so Rob was able to get back home and spend his last couple of weeks there with his wife, Ann, and their three daughters and family. Thanks for all the prayers and space for us over this time which although it has been sad and difficult, it has also been incredibly special.

After seven years in the Methodist Circuit in and around Hinckley, Sarah and I have also said lots of other more expected and planned for goodbyes over the summer. Without doubt it is the part of church life that we hate the most. So it was really good to see people from Hinckley who had travelled to the recent Milton Keynes Methodist Circuit Joint Welcome Service held at Newport Pagnell Baptist Church. The welcome was for Edson Dube as the new Superintendent Minister (i.e. my boss!) as well as for Sarah and me. Lots of the diversity in the Churches in and around Milton Keynes was boldly and colourfully very much on display! Some of the planning and preparations caused some serious headaches, so: many thanks to everyone who was involved in the Circuit celebration in any way! We were well and truly welcomed!

Many thanks also to everyone involved with preparing the manse in Newport Pagnell, our new home. Ministers all moving in the same few weeks leaves not enough time for redecorating etc.! We really appreciate what has been done! So after unpacking nearly all of the boxes we are beginning to move on from sad goodbyes to the better flip side of the moving coin. It is a growing privilege to start to be meeting and getting to know new neighbours and new leaders and members of the Methodist Churches in Hanslope, Newport Pagnell, and Woburn Sands, as well as those in the Stantonbury Ecumenical Partnership, especially Christ Church for the foreseeable future.

Sarah and I are looking forward to journeying with you in all the Churches. We are an ecumenical family: Sarah grew up in Stony Stratford and went to St Mary & St Giles' C of E, and I grew up in a suburb on the west of Birmingham and went to the Methodist Church. I got bored of church, but after studying mechanical engineering and management at Liverpool, I started asking questions and searching for purpose. While studying robot control at Bristol, the amazingly gracious and patient minister and students at "Methsoc" gave me space to ask anything and to, eventually, be found by God. Sarah and I met while volunteering for a year's Christian community work in challenging council estates. We married, I took Sarah's surname (more on that another time!), and have three children, Ben, Lucy, and Emily, and more recently one son-in-law, one daughter-in-law, one son-in-law-to-be, and since January a granddaughter, Eliza!

When we married, I was working in Smethwick at GEC Avery designing laboratory balances. But I sensed that our greatest need is not for more technology, rather it is even more for less selfishness, for more Christ-like self-lessness. So I pushed at the door of ministry in the Methodist Church which surprisingly opened wide! I trained at Queen's College in Birmingham and have dragged the family around and ministered in the Notts and Derbyshire border, Peterborough, North Bedfordshire, and Hinckley. Now we are settling in to Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes, we look forward to walking with you as we all keep wrestling with how to grow in receiving, returning, sharing, and living by Jesus' amazing grace and loving gift of himself for "us" and "them", regardless of whoever and wherever "we" and "they" are.


