you gave up your Son
out of love for the world:
lead us to ponder the mysteries of his passion,
that we may know eternal peace
through the shedding of our Saviour's blood,
Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**



PSALM 51: 1 – 13 (The Archbishops' Council, 2005)

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, in your great goodness; ◆ according to the abundance of your compassion blot out my offences.
- 2 Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness ◆ and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I acknowledge my faults ◆ and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I sinned ◆ and done what is evil in your sight,
- 5 So that you are justified in your sentence ◆ and righteous in your judgement. [R]
- 6 I have been wicked even from my birth, a sinner when my mother conceived me.
- 7 Behold, you desire truth deep within me and shall make me understand wisdom in the depths of my heart.
- 8 Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean; wash me and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 9 Make me hear of joy and gladness, ♦ that the bones you have broken may rejoice. [R]
- 10 Turn your face from my sins ♦ and blot out all my misdeeds.
- 11 Make me a clean heart, O God, ♦ and renew a right spirit within me.
- 12 Cast me not away from your presence and take not your holy spirit from me.
- 13 Give me again the joy of your salvation ♦ and sustain me with your gracious spirit;

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Hebrews 5: 5 – 10 (NRSV)

A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Hebrews

⁵ So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; ⁶ as he says also in another place, 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.'

⁷ In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸ Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; ⁹ and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, ¹⁰ having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Glory to you, O Lord


²⁰ Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' ²²Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

²⁷ 'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' ²⁹ The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' ³⁰ Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake,

not for mine. ³¹Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' ³³He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
