Happy St Patrick's Day! Saint Patrick was a fifth-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Known as the "Apostle of Ireland", he is the primary patron saint of Ireland. Although he wasn't bought up in a Christian family, during a time held captive by raiders and working as a shepherd, he turned to God and became a devout Christian. It is believed he had dreams of God telling him to convert Ireland to Christianity. Many legends have been associated with his life, including that he drove away all the snakes from Ireland and that he introduced the Holy Trinity through the three-leaved shamrock. But one thing stands out-he heard the call of God and followed it through difficulties and hardship, saying among other things "It is honourable to reveal and confess the works of God". This week in times past

1012AD Ælfheah the Archbishop of Canterbury is murdered by Vikings. The Danes again raided England, laid siege to Canterbury and eventually sacked the town, the Cathedral was plundered and burned by the Danes following

Ælfheah's capture. The Anglo-Saxon Chronicle records that "...the raiding-army became much stirred up against the archbishop, because he did not want to offer them any money, and forbade that anything might be granted in return for him. They were very drunk, and pelted him there with bones and the heads of cattle; and one of them struck him on the head, he sank down and his holy blood fell on the earth". Pope Gregory VII canonised Ælfheah in 1078, with a feast day of 19 April. Thomas Becket, later a Archbishop of Canterbury, prayed to Ælfheah just before his murder in Canterbury Cathedral in 1170.
