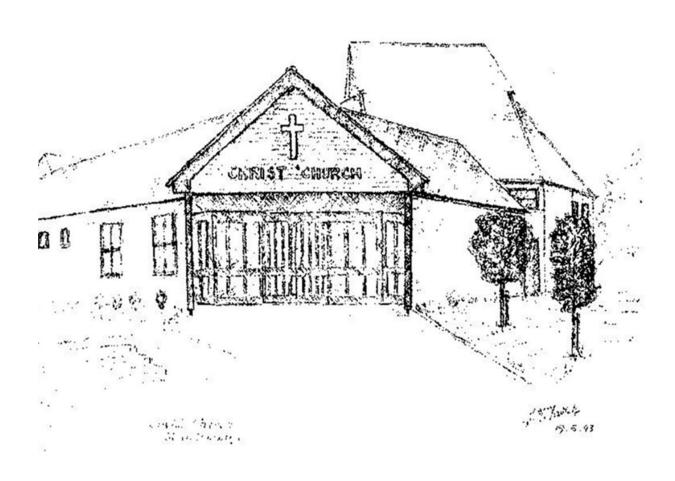

Christ Church Under 5s

The Under 5s group continues to meet in the church hall on Thursday mornings during school term time.

The group has continued to be popular and well attended during the year. There are several childminders who attend regularly, each one bringing several children, along with some parents and grandparents with their little ones.

We greet the children and carers when they arrive and offer the adults a drink while the children play. We have a good selection of toys and equipment some of which are put out each week and other items are swapped to give variety. There is also a craft activity which links to the week's Bible story that the children can take home. We pause for snacks, stories and singing and then there is time to resume playing before the session ends.

When the weather is suitable, we also have outdoor play in the patio area.

At Christmas each child was given a present of a Christmas story book and the adults were given Christmas cards.

It takes a team effort to keep this group running. Each week Joyce welcomes the adults with drinks (and remembers their preferences), Cherill provides a wide range of crafts for the children to enjoy, Penny leads us with music and singing and Susan reads the stories. We have been grateful for Anne's help which enables us to keep running while other members are on holiday. Other offers of help, on a regular or occasional basis, are also welcome.

We are also grateful to Roger and Barry for their help in setting up and clearing away too.

Stantonbury Ecumenical Partnership

Following on from last year's report when the new CIO had only just been registered, the planned structures are now mostly in place. 6 trustees were elected at the AGM in April, though one subsequently resigned in August. There will be a vacancy at the AGM and one of the existing trustees is standing for re-election.

The former church councils or leaders teams are now known as 'Congregational Leadership Teams' The former 'Stantonbury Ecumenical Council' has become the 'Partnership Council'. There is also a Partnership leadership team which combines the clergy and a few other lay members, and this has taken on the roles of the former 'Standing Committee.'

The trustees are effectively the guardians of the finances, governance and safeguarding. We meet around four times per year. The Partnership Council follows more or less the same pattern as the former SEC.

Much attention has focused on the appointments to the ministerial vacancies. We currently have a potential recruit to the Baptist post which we hope to fill in the summer or early autumn. The Anglican post has proved more of a challenge. The original part-time post was dropped in favour of a full-time unlimited contract and the focus has changed because of Paul Smith's imminent retirement in September and the need to appoint a team rector. This will be advertised again shortly, having not been filled last year. We certainly hope to fill that before the end of this year.

To encourage a sense of 'togetherness' in the Partnership there have been some joint services and general meetings with particular focus on 'green' issues and 'inclusion' something that has cascaded down to individual congregations. We continue to share various resources in the form of huddles.

Maggie has been the 'stand-in' safeguarding lead and Diana Stammers is the trustee in charge of safeguarding, but we do need someone to undertake management of the DBS checks and to be involved when incidents happen.

Eco Church

We have been awarded a Bronze Eco Church award. We were assessed for this in 5 categories: Worship & teaching, Buildings, Land, Lifestyle and Community Engagement and are now working towards our Silver Award.

The church committees on behalf of the whole church always consider protecting the natural environment and measures to limit our energy use and other areas that affect climate change when making improvements to our Buildings and Land. In Worship and Teaching we regularly pray for our better stewardship of the earth that God has given us and have followed the course 'Creation Matters' in House Groups. With regard to Community Engagement, we are aware of making our church more inclusive which is our current focus in House Groups and as a church we look for ways to engage with our local community.

However, the Lifestyle category involves us all individually. Through the monthly Eco Tips reported in the CC newsletter and also put on the church noticeboard under 'Creation Care' we are encouraging all church members to look at our individual lifestyles that can contribute so much to protecting the natural environment and reducing greenhouse gases.

Treasurer's report

It is good to be able to report that the finances for 2023 remain in balance. We thank the generosity of members for helping to maintain the level of Gift Aided income. I have, for comparison kept the figures for the Gift Aid claims to four quarters. The consolidated accounts will include the claim for Q4 of 2023 as we have to accrue that in the charity accounts. This will add £2,087 to the 2023 income.

In 2023 the rental income has increased to ~£18k from £11½k in 2022. The 'UK Presbyterian Church of East Africa' have proved very good partners and have contributed generously to the finances in addition to their rental. The Chinese church have continued to use the building extensively at weekends.

We have replaced the projector with screens at the front and the back. The kitchen floor was renewed, and we purchased a new cooker for the kitchen. There have been some additional repairs to the roof.

The SEP finances have improved with savings during the Baptist interregnum, but we continue to pay a large Parish Share to the Diocese despite having had an Anglican vacancy since November 2021.

The improved controls for the heating have helped to keep utility costs down despite more extensive use of the building.

As always, we thank God for his provision to us.
