

News from Diocese of Oxford

Growing congregations

Evidence gathered through the Statistics for Mission study shows recovery from the pandemic lockdowns has continued, and attendance has reached 84% of the 2019 level, up from 81% in 2022. This represents an average of an extra three people attending each church each week.

Encouraging and inspiring youth faith



A youth worker in a Reading parish is having a significant impact in the lives of young people attending church and is reaching into the wider community, supporting knife crime prevention projects.

The Caversham Thameside and Mapledurham parish received a Development Fund grant from the diocese to help provide a youth worker for the next five years, covering the three churches in the parish.

Associate Vicar, the Revd Penny Cuthbert, explains: "When I arrived in 2016, my brief was to change the demographic of St John's as we had a mainly older congregation. In 2018 several new families joined the church, and we employed a part-time Children and Families Outreach Worker

which led to further growth of our children's ministry. As some of these children reached secondary school age, we realised we needed a youth worker.

"Then, following the tragic stabbing of Olly Stephens in January 2021, we set out more mindfully to create a role which would disciple our own youth, and reach into the community too – tackling knife crime.

News from the Regional Central Baptist Union

Love, Pray, Vote THE GENERAL ELECTION WILL BE ON THURSDAY 4 JULY JPIT has recently launched (rather timely it turns out) three major resources for churches to consider.

- 1. A Hustings Resource a comprehensive guide to arranging a local hustings event. With lots of varieties of election meetings to consider, the time is here to reach out to your local ecumenical networks and start planning.
- 2. A General Election issues briefing covering the six issues that frame JPIT's work, this resource explains why we as Christians should give serious consideration to these issues and explores how the issues are relevant at this time in the UK. It also offers a list of three adaptable questions you might like to ask parliamentary candidates.
- 3. Voter Registration Champions. The Electoral Commission estimates that 8 million eligible voters will miss out because they are not properly registered. 4 million eligible voters will miss out because they don't have Photo ID. And 14 million eligible voters won't see the point of turning out to vote. Let's do what we can to ensure all those our churches have contact with have the ability and motivation to take part in the election.

Eco tip for June

Guppy Bags

Plastic pollution is a global problem. Microplastics are minute pieces of plastic, invisible to the naked eye, that are present in our oceans.

Have you heard about Guppy bags? They are laundry bags that filter out the microplastic fibres which are shed from synthetic clothing every time it is washed. One ecologist estimates that one single piece of clothing can shed about 1,900 pieces of microfibres in one wash.

Although not a perfect solution Guppy bags can reduce the amount of microplastics entering our water system and are easily available from online retailers. It is worth doing some research to help you decide whether it's one thing you could do towards reducing plastic pollution in our oceans.
