



New dates released for diocesan safeguarding training

The Autumn/Winter 2024 Safeguarding Learning Programme is now <u>available on the website</u>. We have a range of online and face-to-face sessions available between now and the end of the year. Leadership or PtO safeguarding training needs to be renewed every three years.

Other training delivered by the National Safeguarding Team can be found on the <u>online learning portal</u>. This includes Safer Recruitment and People Management and Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse, which also needs renewing every three years.

The vacancy for the Bishop of Buckingham's position is going to be advertised soon and the date of 27th February 2025 has already been set for the selected person to begin work as a Bishop.

I know this is already quite long enough, but I am adding this month's letter from Dave Haseldine as the **Last Word** as I found it very relevant. I hope you agree, so over to Dave. JP

Letter from Dave Haseldine July 2024

Nick, a local C of E vicar recently got me thinking about how we discuss and debate with one another hot topics and controversial issues. We do not do this very well often, especially on social media, but also face-to-face. I read Nick's article as a plea for each one of us to engage in any and all debates with an attitude of humility and openness and to recognise our common humanity: thinking I might be wrong, or at the very least there are things that I have yet to learn, and I might learn some of them from those I strongly disagree with, indeed they might be the only people I might learn those things from, and that might also be true the other way round!

As it turns out, Nick's topic and words were very timely since I write this in the middle of a general election! So we are in even greater need of really listening to the variety of perspectives, experiences, and voices of the people in our communities who are virtually the same as me and my way of thinking (rare), or who have virtually nothing in common with me (also rare), or who are an amazing mix of both (that's virtually everyone!).

The ministers of a local Churches Together group meet weekly for conversation and to pray together. As we have met and talked on a wide variety of topics including politics, football, Israel and Gaza, and other things, I have been surprised, delighted, and disappointed in various measures when our thinking has been similar, and when our thinking has been utterly different. And when our views have been the most surprisingly different, those times have been when I have had to listen the most, and think hardest about why the person who is speaking thinks as they do, as well as think hardest about what has been and still is going on in me that makes me disagree with them, or better, disagree with what they are saying, and think hardest about assumptions I make about them and their views and me and mine. Have you come across this quote by an apparently renowned philosopher named William James: ""A great many people think they are thinking when they are merely rearranging their prejudices"? I remember when I first came across it and I winced and thought, "Ouch! I do that!"

Human beings need to talk well with one another!

So the ministers of the local Churches Together group discussed and held a General Election hustings so that people in the community could gather and meet the candidates to be appointed as their MP, discover who they are as human beings, listen to them, hear their ideas, and let them be debated and scrutinised in ways that were respectful, fair, honest and robust. It turned out that each of the candidates also wanted the same things as the Church ministers wanted: democracy at its best, nationally, locally and individually. However, one thing that we Church ministers had not thought about was the need for security for all the candidates. Ouch. Although our democratic processes are very far from ideal, remembering the bravery of murdered MPs Jo Cox and David Amess, and looking at too many other nations, may we realise what a fragile and precious thing we have in the democracy here.

The hustings went as well as we could have hoped: it was a safe, respectful, honest, and robust Q&A, helping all the 150 or so different people attending to decide how to use the precious right and gift they have to cast their vote on July 4th.

Jesus said to people to pray for even their enemies. So may you and I pray that: the person elected will be a real constituency MP, trying to respond with integrity to every constituent who contacts them regardless of whether they received their vote or not; and also that we will treat our MP, and each unelected candidate too, as the human being that they are regardless of whether we voted for them or not. Amen?
