General Election statements. Joint statement following the General Election from Baptist, Methodist and United Reformed Church leaders

We congratulate Sir Keir Starmer on his appointment as Prime Minister, and all who will now take their seats representing their constituencies as Members of Parliament in Westminster.

The election campaign has been hard-fought, but we know that the real challenges still lie ahead.

The new government inherits a situation where poverty in the UK has been increasing and deepening at an alarming rate. Conflict and persecution in different parts of the world are forcing many to flee their homes to seek safety in other countries including the UK. The existential threat of climate change is causing enormous suffering to both humankind and the wider natural world. There is an urgent need for politicians to restore trust and rebuild integrity in public life. There are also huge pressures on the NHS, on social care, on the criminal justice system, education and other public services, as well as on the public finances.

It is clear that there is an appetite for change in the country, but also a need to restore faith in the ability of politics to meet these challenges.

We urge the new government to put the needs of those who are most vulnerable and marginalised at the forefront as it wrestles to respond to these problems. We also encourage it to work in partnership with local communities to tackle them, in recognition that we all have a part to play in these endeavours, and welcome the commitment made by the new Prime Minister to build strong partnerships with faith groups. Churches across the UK will continue to respond practically in many different ways, but we also look forward to building relationships with the new government and newly elected MPs, and remain ready to support policies and initiatives that offer just and sustainable long-term solutions.

We offer our prayers for the Prime Minister, for the new government and for all elected MPs. We will pray for God's blessing to be on all endeavours to seek peace, justice and the wellbeing of this nation – and where we can embody that blessing, we will

The Methodist Conference – Leeds – June/July 2024

The Methodist Conference met in Leeds from 27^{th} June – 3^{rd} July. The Conference is the governing body of the Methodist Church and meets annually to discuss matters affecting the life of the Church, the nation and the world.

A report received by the Conference detailed the work undertaken since the God For All strategy was agreed in 2020 and how this has since been shaping the mission and ministry of the Methodist Church while supporting its people in evangelism, discipleship, missional growth and leadership.

The Conference voted to re-affirm the strategy, renewing its objectives until 2032.

Director of Evangelism and Growth, Trey Hall, detailed how God For All is already bearing fruit.

Eco tip for August

August can be when we look forward to time to enjoy Summer perhaps taking a holiday or days out.

If you like to walk or bike, have particular interests in wildlife or want activities for families The Parks Trust has a large programme of activities planned. Many are free. <u>https://www.theparkstrust.com/whats-on-in-your-parks</u>

Thinking about lowering our car use we can go by bus to many areas of Milton Keynes and beyond. Or to go by train for further afield.

However, we can also think about how we drive our vehicles to reduce fuel use and pollution:

A Roche Eco churches suggests:

Your driving:

- Avoid sudden braking and unnecessary acceleration.
- Drive more slowly. A car driven at 60mph uses 15% less fuel than one driven at 70mph.

• Don't use the air conditioning. At speeds below 40mph having the windows open does not affect the car's aerodynamic efficiency.

• Turn the engine off when idling if you expect to be idling for more than ten seconds.

The car:

• Remove wind resistance and weight; the top box left on when it's not needed, and 'stuff' kept in the boot which both reduce efficiency.

• Keeping tyres inflated and maintaining the car can save 10% of fuel costs.

Planning your trips:

- Plan to drive outside of rush hours; stop/start is very inefficient.
- Add short drives together, cars are more efficient when the engine is warm.

• Google Maps has pledged to start to show the most eco-friendly route by 2030. Other apps and online maps may follow suit or be in advance so do look out for these developments.

• If possible, use other forms of transport which are more energy efficient: <u>https://energysavingtrust.org.uk/advice/efficient-driving</u> I hope that you find this and previous newsletters interesting and useful.
