Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we reflect on the journey we have shared over the past few months, I want to begin by thanking you all for your openness and for the warm responses to our first pastoral letter. I have been greatly encouraged by the enthusiasm many of you have shown, even as we consider some necessary changes in our life as a community, particularly the proposed adjustments to service times. I understand that this has sparked mixed feelings for some, and I want to assure you that I hear your concerns. I truly believe that, in time, as we continue to worship together, God will guide us in ways that allow every congregation to flourish.

In the spirit of thanksgiving, we continue to rejoice in the many blessings we have celebrated during our Harvest services across the churches. As Psalm 65:9-13 reminds us, "You visit the earth and water it; you enrich it abundantly. The streams of God are filled with water to provide the people with grain, for so you have ordained it." It has been a privilege to witness how, just as God provides for the earth, He provides for us as His people. May we carry this spirit of gratitude into the rest of the year, trusting in God's faithful provision in every season of our lives.

As we move into November, our hearts turn towards reflection and remembrance. This is a time in the church calendar when we pause to reflect **on the saints who have gone before us, the lives of those we've lost,** and **the sacrifices made by many for our freedom.**

We will begin November by commemorating *All Saints' Day* (1st November), a day that calls us to reflect on the lives of the faithful who have lived out their witness to Christ. As the book of Revelation reminds us, "*They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat*" (Revelation 7:16). We remember that those who have gone before us now rest in the presence of God.

Shortly after, we will mark *All Souls' Day* (2nd November), a time to remember and pray for our own loved ones who have passed away. Many find comfort in this service as we honour their memory and entrust them into God's loving care. We are reminded

in John 14:2-3, where Jesus says, "In my Father's house are many rooms... I am going there to prepare a place for you." Let us take solace in the promise of eternal life as we bring to mind those we miss dearly.

We then move towards *Remembrance Sunday* (10th November), a service that holds deep significance for many. It is a time when we honour the courage, sacrifice, and dedication of all who have served in the armed forces and those who continue to protect us today. As we gather to pray for peace in our world, we reflect on the words of Jesus in John 15:13: "*Greater love has no one than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.*" Let this service be an opportunity to renew our commitment to living as peacemakers in our own communities and in the wider world.

As November progresses, we begin preparing our hearts for *Advent*, which starts on the 1st of December. Advent is a season of waiting and anticipation as we look forward to celebrating the birth of Christ at Christmas and reflect on His second coming. The last Sunday in November is often a time to focus on the theme of hope, remembering that God's promises are faithful and true. Romans 15:13 reminds us, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

During this special month, I encourage you to engage fully in these services. Each one offers a unique opportunity to deepen our faith, to remember God's faithfulness, and to gather in fellowship as the Body of Christ.

I invite you to bring your family and friends, and let us make our churches vibrant places of worship and reflection. God is with us through it all. He promises in Matthew 18:20, "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." We are not alone; His presence is with us in every act of worship, in every prayer, and in every service we attend.

Finally, I ask that you continue to pray for one another, for our churches, and for our shared mission as we head into this new season. May we seek God's guidance together, confident in His love and provision.

Update from the Hooke Heritage Project

The St Mary Magdalene Willen Hooke Heritage project was created to repair and preserve its grade 1 church and provide it with toilet, servery and meeting facilities (it currently has none of these). The project reports to the Stantonbury Ecumenical Partnership Council and is being delivered by a very small group from St Mary Magdalene Church and the wider community.

With a feasibility study now completed and with the Diocese of Oxford, Historic England and MK City Council providing encouragement in principle to proceed, preparation is now in hand to deliver ambitious, creative and engaging activities to further inform the church's planning (more of that later).

Whilst our small group has project planning, delivery and funding experience we feel the need for additional advice on communications (web development, branding, technology/data) and in project delivery (legal/contractual, business planning, financial, archaeology/biodiversity). If you, or people you know are intrigued enough to want to know more, and have expertise to share, could we maybe meet for a chat and, without commitment, just see where the conversation takes us?





News from The United Reformed Church

Eco tip for November

Nature Friendly Gardening Guide

Gardens in urban areas make up almost 50% of urban green space and contain 25% of non-forest or woodland trees. So making our gardens wildlife friendly has a major impact on many species.

The Nature Friendly Gardening Guide from the Soil Association has ideas for how you can make changes to your garden, window box, balcony or terrace to be more friendly to wildlife. You can find the guide by following the link:

Ben, Head of Horticulture at the Soil Association, writes:

In this guide, we'll look at why autumn is a good time to plant and what to plant. I'll share my experience on how to plant a tree, as well as how to keep it healthy once it's in the ground.

There are also some top tips for how to help wildlife over the winter, from leaving seed heads for songbirds and growing cover crops to protect the soil, to creating much needed habitats for insects.
