PSALM 16 (The Archbishops' Council, 2000)

- 1 Preserve me, O God, for in you have I taken refuge; ◆ I have said to the Lord, 'You are my lord, all my good depends on you.'
- 2 All my delight is upon the godly that are in the land, upon those who are noble in heart.
- 3 Though the idols are legion that many run after, ◆ their drink offerings of blood I will not offer, neither make mention of their names upon my lips.
- 4 The Lord himself is my portion and my cup; ◆ in your hands alone is my fortune.
- 5 My share has fallen in a fair land; ♦ indeed, I have a goodly heritage.
- 6 I will bless the Lord who has given me counsel, ♦ and in the night watches he instructs my heart.
- 7 I have set the Lord always before me; he is at my right hand; I shall not fall.
- 8 Wherefore my heart is glad and my spirit rejoices; my flesh also shall rest secure.
- 9 For you will not abandon my soul to Death, ♦ nor suffer your faithful one to see the Pit.
- 10 You will show me the path of life; in your presence is the fullness of joy ◆ and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

Daniel 12: 1 – 3 (NRSV)

A reading from the Book of Daniel

'At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. ²Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. ³Those who

are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Hebrews 10: 11 – 14, 19 – 25 (NRSV)

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews

¹¹ And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. ¹²But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God', ¹³and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' ¹⁴For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), ²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. ²⁴And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one

another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

GOSPEL READING

Mark 13: 1 - 8 (NRSV)

Hear the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark Glory to you, O Lord

As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, 'Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!' ²Then Jesus asked him, 'Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.' ³ When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, ⁴'Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?' ⁵Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Beware that no one leads you astray. ⁶Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray. ⁷When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. ⁸For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.
