LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE ADVENT 3 (Three candles are lit)


One candle to remind us of the prophets, the second for John the Baptist, and the third for Mary, who gladly responded to the call of God.

Scripture verse:

Prayer: Surprising God,

We thank you for the joyful obedience of Mary. We ask you to fill us with your grace, so that we, too, may accept your call, and rejoice in your salvation. *Amen*..



- Sing to the Lord a new song, ♦ for he has done marvellous things.
- 2 His own right hand and his holy arm ♦ have won for him the victory.
- 3 The Lord has made known his salvation; ♦ his deliverance has he openly shown in the sight of the nations.
- 4 He has remembered his mercy and faithfulness towards the house of Israel, ♦ and all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.
- 5 Sound praises to the Lord, all the earth; ♦ break into singing and make music.
- 6 Make music to the Lord with the lyre, ♦ with the lyre and the voice of melody.
- 7 With trumpets and the sound of the horn ◆ sound praises before the Lord, the King.
- 8 Let the sea thunder and all that fills it, the world and all that dwell upon it.
- 9 Let the rivers clap their hands ♦ and let the hills ring out together before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth.
- 10 In righteousness shall he judge the world ◆ and the peoples with equity.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Ephesians 1: 3 – 6, 11 – 12 (NRSV)

A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Philippians

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory.

Luke 1: 26 – 38 (NRSV)

Hear the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke Glory to you, O Lord



²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' ²⁹But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. 33He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' 34 Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' 35The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son: and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God.' ³⁸Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.
