Reflection

The donkey story on Palm Sunday is perhaps one of the most poignant and endearing to mark this special day. The details too of how Jesus seems to organise for the animals availability clearly surprised his disciples. We know that this is a direct reference to Zechariah 9 v 9, where the Prophet predicts a 'triumphant and victorious' king will come, but 'humble' and on a donkey, rather than a war horse. Jesus saw the two contrasting sides of his ministry encapsulated by this animal, and no doubt sends a message to his followers suggesting our attitude as well. There is victory and joy in how we serve the Lord, but it is through our own humble attitude today.

Myanmar As the epicentre of the earthquake last month, Myanmar has faced the most serious consequences of the disaster. This is on top of the humanitarian and human rights crisis, which has been deteriorating since the 2021 military coup. Shockingly, the military junta continued airstrikes in the aftermath of the deadly quake. Please pray that Myanmar's military will immediately stop airstrikes on civilians and for the relief and recovery efforts, taking place amid an ongoing conflict and humanitarian crisis. Muslim communities have been particularly affected. Christian communities have faced similar, significant challenges. More than 600 Buddhist monasteries have also been impacted.
