When you consider that every Saint is celebrated for their own inspirational story of faith it is indeed a great choice for this particular festival. My own thoughts lead me though to ponder the humility of this man who it seems did not expect the attention our Lord ultimately gives him - shocking too to everyone else gathered that day. We also know that Zacchaeus' life is profoundly changed by the encounter, given that he returned far more than he had ever taken from his customers.
