





Reflection

Isaiah 35:1-10. Driving home for Christmas. Isaiah prophesies that a highway will be provided for the Jewish exiles in Babylon to return home to Jerusalem. The first returnees endured an 800-mile slog through dry and rough terrain. But now, Isaiah proclaims, the way back will be easy. The road will be open for bona fide returnees; it will be safe from dangerous animals; water will stave off thirst and mirages. Moreover, there will be health and wholeness for the frail or disabled. No wonder there will be a song in the hearts and mouths of the pilgrims returning to Jerusalem! Reading this prophecy during Advent and after the coming of Jesus leads to Christian interpretation of it. Our exile is in sin and separation from God. Jesus is the Highway, providing the Way to our true home in heaven. Does that provoke you to sing? God Bless, Paul

Nicaragua Good news for Advent! Carmen and Lesbia have been released to house arrest. These two women (Roman Catholic lay leaders) were detained without reason on 10 Aug 2024. They were targeted as part of a wider crackdown on fundamental freedoms in Nicaragua. Their families had had no contact with them for nearly 16 months. But Carmen and Lesbia were among a small group of political prisoners released into house arrest on Saturday 29 Nov. While they are still not free, this is without doubt an improvement on solitary confinement in a maximum-security prison. Let's give thanks for this answer to prayer and continue to remember the prisoners this Christmas (Hebrews 13:3). We will not stop praying for Carmen and Lesbia, and many others like them, until they are fully free.
