

##### Lets review, and continue to build



## **Pastoral Letter to the Congregations**

### **Preparing Ourselves for Lent: The Significance of Ash Wednesday and Ashing**

Lent is a season of reflection, penitence, and spiritual renewal observed by Christians across the world. For those in the Anglican tradition, Lent offers a sacred journey towards Easter, marked by self-examination, prayer, and acts of discipline. The period of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which falls on 18th February this year, ushering in forty days (excluding Sundays) of preparation for the celebration of Christ's resurrection.

#### **The Origin and Meaning of Lent**

The word "Lent" is derived from the Old English word 'Lenten', meaning spring, referencing the season in which it falls. Historically, Lent draws inspiration from Jesus' forty days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness, as recounted in the Gospels. Early Christians adopted this period as a time of preparation for baptism, and over the centuries, it evolved into a season for all believers to renew their commitment to Christ through repentance and spiritual discipline.

#### **Ash Wednesday and the Practice of Ashing**

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is observed with a special service in which worshippers receive the sign of the cross in ash on their foreheads. The practice of ashing has its roots in ancient Jewish tradition, where the use of ashes was a sign of mourning and repentance. The ashes themselves are typically made by burning the palm crosses from the previous year's Palm Sunday, symbolising both the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem and the fleeting nature of earthly glory.

The ashing ceremony carries profound meaning. As the priest applies the ashes, the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" are spoken. This serves as a humbling reminder of our mortality and our need for God's grace. The act of ashing is not simply about acknowledging our sinfulness, but about opening ourselves to transformation and renewal through Christ's mercy. It is an invitation to turn away from those things that draw us from God and to embrace practices that draw us closer to Him.

#### **Preparing Our Hearts for Lent**

As we approach Lent, it is helpful to set aside time for honest self-reflection, seeking God's guidance in recognising those areas of our lives in need of change. Many find it meaningful to adopt a Lenten discipline—such as fasting, prayer, or charitable giving—not as an end in itself, but as a way of making space for God. This season is ultimately about drawing nearer to Christ, deepening our dependence on Him, and preparing our hearts to rejoice in the hope and new life offered at Easter.

### **Report on the visit to SEP by Bishop Dave Bull, Bishop of Buckingham**

We welcomed Bishop Dave on the evening of January 6<sup>th</sup> to St Andrews Church, and he was joined by Acting Associate Archdeacon Deiniol Heywood. This meeting had been suggested to encourage SEP Churches with the continuing uncertainty in our Ministerial team. Advanced questions had been encouraged and the meeting centred on these, with worship organised as we came together and at the conclusion led by our Ministers. Over 90 SEP members attended - representing all of our churches.

The Bishop began by encouraging us to continue the work we were doing and confirming that we have his support as much as possible. He reported though that there was little prospect of a resolution to the situation this year, and for the moment we continue to rely on our other clergy, who actually are making a great team. Other Parishes are not as well supported as we are.

We asked about possible other additional Clergy coming to us to help, but were told that no paid staff were available and there is also no chance of getting a curate, without an active Rector in place. Increase of Clergy in MK is on the Bishop's radar, but longer term, and part of a wider strategy. The Bishop also prompted that we have a Rector, and we are responsible for him. There is some relief on the parish share available due to suspension (10%), but we must treat this 'the same' if we had a long term illness in the team. Acting Associate Archdeacon Deiniol talked about the Diocese finances generally being flat, and there is no reimbursement (insurance) against this sort of situation. Comment was made however that we will be looked at favourably for any good application for the Diocese Development Fund, and an application is currently being drafted for SEP particularly targeting the youth work we had begun recently.

Questions were also aired concerning the future of the Church School in Great Linford and the Bishop confirmed there are Diocesan discussions happening on this subject. The building is tied to use for education purposes.

There followed also encouragement for SEP members to continue to discuss and advocate for the partnership's work, with some negativity being expressed about its future. The Bishop generally encouraged us that the Kingdom is growing, and mission is flourishing around us. We need to maintain prayer, commitment and dedication, in the power of the Holy Spirit. God will provide for our needs and grow his church.

His vision will take a decade to put in place and he asked for our support and prayer and plea to work together to bring about a more Christ-like Milton Keynes. He will move to live in Milton Keynes when his son finishes 6<sup>th</sup> form next year.

With his links to Bletchley Park, the National Museum of Computing and the College's Institute of Technology, he has also played his part shaping MK.

## **News from Diocese of Oxford**



### **The next Archdeacon of Buckingham will be the Revd Cassa Messervy. She takes up the role in March next year.**

Cassa is currently the rector of the Wychert Vale benefice, having moved there in 2021 and has spent all her time in the diocese after she was ordained in 2011. She served her curacy in Beaconsfield, before moving to Seer Green and Jordans. She said: "I am looking forward to seeing all that God is doing in our deaneries and working with and for the wonderful people of the Buckingham Archdeaconry." During her time in the diocese, Cassa has served as an associate Area Dean in Amersham and as a Co-Area Dean in Aylesbury. She has also served on the Diocesan Synod, the Bishop's Council, and Oxford Diocesan Bucks Schools Trust. Cassa is chair of the English Clergy Association and Lighthouse Haddenham.

Bishop of Buckingham, the Rt Revd Dave Bull, said: "We very much look forward to welcoming Cassa to the senior team in the Buckingham area. Please pray for her and her family as she prepares to take up her role." Cassa has been involved with Lighthouse Beaconsfield, planting new family focussed congregations and has served as a governor in several schools. Cassa has an academic interest in ecclesiastical law. Cassa takes up the role after the Revd Guy Elsmore retired in September last year, after nine years' service.

Attendance During the week: Please give the number of children/young people/adults with whom the church has regular contact through church organised activities on Sundays and mid-week - e.g. Sunday school, uniformed organisations, youth clubs, Drop-in centres, Seniors Groups etc. Please note that the ages given are a guide and are not prescriptive. Note also that the number of adults' figure should include your church members as well as any others who attend Sunday services and/or weekday activities on a regular basis.

Baptisms: This is the number of Believers Baptisms which took place in the last calendar year. Ecumenical Church/Partnerships: If you are an ecumenical church (LEP) please put the total number of members in 'Total LEP membership' and the

number of Baptist members in 'Church Members'. In some LEPs these figures will be the same as all members are seen as members of all the participating denominations.

**Church Members:** Those who have been accepted by the fellowship and committed themselves to support, and participate in, the life of the church including discerning the will of God through the church meeting

**Children (0-10) & Young People (11-17)** Those you have regular contact through church organised activities on Sundays and mid-week, eg Sunday school, uniformed organisations, youth clubs, etc

**Adults (18+)** Include church members as well as any others who attend Sunday services and/or weekday activities on a regular basis such as drop-in centres, seniors groups etc  
**Children (0-10) Young People (11-17) Young Adults (18-30) Other Adults (31-64) Seniors (65+)**

### Eco Tip February 2026

#### Carbon Fast for Lent

As Christians we are encouraged to fast during Lent.

Following last month's eco tip to calculate your carbon footprint, A Rocha is suggesting that we take part in the Carbon Fast for Lent.

The challenge is to live more simply and reduce your carbon footprint. Each week will feature a different theme to help us take climate action.
